TIPS ON PACKING YOUR SHOEBOX

- 1. Use new items as used clothing and toys will be discarded.
- 2. Each box stands alone so don't divide items between two boxes.
- 3. Include some fun in each box as this may be the only gift some of these children receive all year.
- 4. Remove all wrappings from your items as many sites have no place to put trash.
- 5. A tooth brush may be sent but no candy or toothpaste as they have a "use by date."
- 6. Include your \$10 check for each box. If you do multiple boxes one check will suffice and place in one of your boxes.

You may also go online using a credit card where you will receive a tracking number strip which you can print and attach to the shoe box.

7. Place the boy/girl strip at the end of the box. Place a rubber band around the box. Later these boxes will be taped around the middle for shipment.

Boxes will be picked up by November 17.
