

Stoke the Fire of Your Faith

On a cold winter's day there are few things more inviting than a nice warm fire in the fireplace. A good fire will warm not only your hands and your feet, but it will even warm your heart. It just makes you feel better all the way around.

However, the thing about a fire is that it cannot go untended. Left to its own devices the fire burns down and the flame dies out. And soon, all you are left with are the dying embers of what used to be good fire.

To keep the fire going you have to take the poker and stoke the fire. You have to move around some of the wood in the fireplace to open it up to more air so that the oxygen can feed the flame again. Sometimes you even have to fan the flame a little bit to get it burning bright again. Fires take a little bit of work to keep going. Otherwise, they die out and grow cold.

Paul suggests that the Christian life is like that, too. In 2 Timothy 1:6, Paul says, "For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God." Paul suggests that just like a fire in the fireplace, you and I need to tend the flame of our faith in God.

Our faith, like a fire, needs tending. Our relationship with God needs to be fed. Sometimes you and I need to take a spiritual poker and stoke the fire. We need to fan the flame. We have to stir the cold embers of our faith and get it burning bright again so that the fire of our love for God blazes for all to see.


For the month of January we will be in the series, *Jesus: His Mission*. Each week we will have a lesson about Jesus as He prepared for his ministry.
